As part of the new pathway to the SEL Microcredential, the Center for Holistic Education is offering another series of SEL Workshops to Southern Oregon University students and HTLC community members.

Workshop #3, Foundations in SEL: Native American Perspective & Practice, is a two-part experiential hands-on workshop.
